Message from Rev'd Mpole Masemola

"He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together." (Colossians 1:17)

Christ the King Day is upon us! To be honest, I almost missed its significance amid the busyness of life—that is, until I went through the words of "Rejoice, the Lord is King," our hymn for the offertory. One can only imagine the energy filling the church as we belt out those triumphant words: "Lift up your heart, lift up your voice; rejoice, again I say rejoice!" To me, this hymn smells of HOPE—a refreshing antidote to a world weighed down by uncertainty and hardship.

Christ the King Sunday traces its roots to 1925, a time when the world was fractured by post-war struggles, and political turmoil. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast as a bold reminder that Christ reigns supreme above earthly powers. Amid nationalist ideologies and growing materialism, this celebration declared that true peace and authority rest only in Jesus Christ. It was a call to lift our gaze beyond the fleeting kingdoms of this world to the eternal kingdom of God—a kingdom of truth, justice, and love.

Fast forward nearly a hundred years, and our world is no less in need of Christ's kingship. Headlines are dominated by wars, environmental crises, political instability, and social injustice. Fear often tightens its grip, leaving many of us anxious about tomorrow. Nations wrestle with divisions, and ideologies sometimes blind us to the image of God in our neighbours. The pressures we face are daunting, and the promises of this world often fall short. But today, as we gather to celebrate Christ the King, we are reminded of a truth that transcends time: Jesus reigns, holding all things together, even when life feels chaotic.

As Christians, we are called to be a hopeful people—reflecting the light of Christ's kingdom in a world desperate for direction. Colossians 1:13-20 reminds us that Christ has "rescued us from the dominion of darkness" and brought us into His glorious kingdom. This calling requires us to live boldly, trusting that His authority is eternal, and His love is unfailing.

So, as we sing together "Rejoice, the Lord is King," let's lift our hearts and voices in joyful proclamation. Light a candle in your heart for hope. Christ is King—yesterday, today, and forever. Let us rejoice! Mpole

The very first martyr was Stephen. But as the New Testament continues its story, we see that there were others as well. In fact, the Apostle Peter refers to persecution as occurring 'throughout the world' .You may not realise that it still occurs today and that each year there are many Christians who are discriminated against, cast out from families and friends, kidnapped and enslaved, or even killed for their faith.
