Message from Rev'd Mpole Masemola

Dear Friends,

This week brings us to the end of August and ushers us into September. August has been exciting and challenging in its own way – from observing the Season of Holy Women, through celebrating Harvest Festival, to remembering the Martyrs of Papua New Guinea. Fed by all of these, I hope each of us have found a way of growth in our sense of discipleship, and that we will see the fruit of this growth in time. In the words of the Collect prayer for Martyrs Day, may God "turn our weakness into strength [...] and give us the courage to live in faithful witness".

September, which officially ushers in the season of spring, comes with its own beauties and opportunities. I am witnessing the busyness that comes with preparations for the Galvanized: Festival of Heritage and getting yet another way of understanding ourselves, the Ipswich Anglican Community, as a part of the heritage of the City of Ipswich. With all our activities and ministries, we continue to be a part of the city's living story — a part of our city's perpetual springtime of new life. You may get a sense of what I mean when you look at the notices in this pew bulletin: a whole buffet of programs to be enjoyed.

September also ushers in the Season of Creation whose main theme for 2025 is "Peace with Creation". You will notice that the themes for each Sunday in this season will revolve around this main theme. The 2025 Season of Creation is special as its takes place during the 1700th anniversary of the first council of Nicaea (the ecumenical council that gave us the first draft of the Nicene Creed we use today). 2025 is a springtime in ecumenical focus – a springtime of the whole church collectively remembering and seeking ways of living in peace with creation.

As we enter September, we have a whole feast of Heritage, Culture, and Creation before us. I encourage you to take full advantage of this springtime, whether at church, at the Proms or concerts, or at the fashion parade (St Thomas) or while touring the city, and as we befriend ourselves anew with God created order. As we do all that, may we in the words of the Collect for Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost prays, "may learn to recognise each other as brothers and sisters gathered together around [God's] your table". May you experience a springtime of your own personal lives.

May they have opportunity to share the love of God through their faith in you. We also pray for the members in Oke-Osun as they often face persecution. Give them courage to be steadfast in trusting you. Amen.
